

P.B.ACHARYA EXHORTS STUDENTS OF CITY COLLEGE

City College of Arts and Commerce held its 23rd annual Freshers Meet 2015, on 3rd October 2015, with the Governor of Nagaland and Assam P.B.Acharya as the chief guest.

Speaking on the occasion P.B Acharya termed skill education as the most important for any institution to march forward. Emphasizing on the importance of skills for one to be employable he regretted that Indian universities are creating more and more educated un-employed youth and felt the urgent need for reviewing the present situation.

“Education is not only to get degree but only the beginning of life”, he observed and said, “Education should give knowledge to provide wealth”. He lamented that rather than becoming asset, youth are becoming liability after studying for several years and called for change of mindset from principals, chancellors, academicians and intellectuals.

Citing that in Mumbai with a population of one and a half crores, 75 to 80 lakhs live in slums, despite 8 persons from Mumbai being listed amongst the 100 richest people in the world.

“This shows lack of corporate responsibility amongst the educated people who are self-centered”, he commented.

Unless education tells you that you own a debt to the state and nation, that is not education in the truest sense, he maintained.

Acharya pointed out that from Knowledge point of view India is second to none yet regretted that Universities have failed to address the present situation due to lack of skill education in the present education system. He appealed to the students and management of College of Art & Commerce to be a vibrant institution and to become an asset for the nation.

The Governor also released the 1st Annual College Magazine on the occasion. The day was marked by ethnic display, special numbers and felicitation.

The programme was held in the College campus under the theme “Scaling New Heights”.
