## NAGALAND IS RICH IN NATURAL RESOURCES, TALENT AND MANPOWER: PB ACHARYA

The Governor of Nagaland, Shri PB Acharya stated that Nagaland is rich in natural resources, talent and manpower; however we need the right guidance, machinery, training to achieve the full potential.
