SPEECH OF SHRI P.B. ACHARYA, HON'BLE GOVERNOR OF NAGALAND AT THE INAUGURAL FUNCTION OF

HORNBILL FESTIVAL AT KISAMA ON 1ST DECEMBER, 2015

All the tribes are equal and no tribe is second to other. Every tribe has its own distinct identity and grandeur of their culture, which our guests may be able to see for themselves. We have our indigenous games and you can have a glimpse of our sports. We have handloom/handicrafts stalls and the products are domestically made. There are indigenous designs and colours in each shawl and each piece is unique. The possessor of the product will be very proud to have one. Feel Nagaland and enjoy its products. When you interact with the Naga village youths, you will experience joy and rebound their happiness or joyous mood with loud laughter expression.

Every tribe has its own festival and throughout the year Nagas are fortunate to have festivals and festivities. The month of December in Nagaland is an auspicious month and Christmas is celebrated all people enthusiastically to commemorate the birth of Jesus Christ. People celebrate this memorable day in various ways.

Nagaland has achieved remarkable progress over the last five decades, particularly in the fields of education and healthcare. Nagaland is very rich in bio-diversity, both flora and fauna. This bio-diversity would ensure that tourism and investment would come to the state. We must face the multifarious tasks that confront us today with courage, determination and self confidence. There is tremendous potential in Nagaland; the youth have tremendous vibrant and creative energy. We have to improve the quality of the life of the weaker sections. I have faith that it can be done through the collective and concerned efforts by all sections of the society. Each and every citizen of Nagaland – irrespective of their place and position has contributed in the growth of our State, without which the change we see in the social and economy sectors would not have been possible.

Ours is an agricultural society. Our organic produce must have a proper market and our *kissans* should be a prosperous record. This picturesque setting for the festival gives a heavenly feel to them. Unity in diversity is the peculiarity of our country.

We all know that this festival was witnessed by our Hon'ble Prime Minister last year. During his speech he has told us to introspect and look back at what has been achieved over the last 50 years and what ground remains to be covered. Today, Government of India under the dynamic leadership of Shri Narendra Modiji, Hon'ble Prime Minister of India has signed a historic framework agreement with the NSCN (IM) on 3rd August 2015 sixty years after first insurgent shots. This 'Frame work

Accord' can serve as a new paradigm for security and federalism, reconciling respectfully the aspirations of the Nagas with the larger vision of a strong India. Modiji stated during his speech at the signing ceremony, - "peace, security and economic transformation in the north-east". The expectation is that the Naga peace accord will greatly serve India's security and economic interests in the strategically important eastern frontier. Modiji described the accord as "historic". On this auspicious occasion, I appeal to all the factions to join the peace process for a graceful and permanent solution of the Naga problem. Let us work together to make our Nagaland a great and prosperous state.

With this few words, I once again wish you all on the occasion of our 52nd Statehood Day and an enjoyable celebration of the Hornbill Festival. I hope you all take back pleasant memories from here so that you come back again and continue to bless our state with your leadership qualities. I congratulate all the officials and individuals, departments and NGOs who have worked hard and sacrificed their time and energy to make this event happen. And also my best wishes to the organizers, sponsors, volunteers and all participants whose hard work has realised the 2015 Hornbill festival. Your support and hard work will definitely build on the success of this great festival.

With these words, I declare the Hornbill Festival 2015, Festival of Festivals, open.
